

bindweed (Convolvulus arvensis)

Perennial vines with round white blossoms often mistaken for their close cousins - MORNING glory

Flowers are bell or trumpet-shaped, white to pink in color, and up to 1 inch long.

Average number of seeds produced per plant ranges from 25 to 300!

Field bindweed seeds can remain viable in soil for up to

40 YEARS.

Taproot can go as deep as 20 feet into soil.

Trellising may be a beneficial way to guide growth away from nearby plants + still enjoy the flowers.
